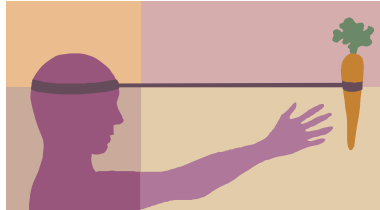

Learn about national initiatives designed to assist people with disabilities to work without losing their cash benefits and/or health benefits through Medicare and Medicaid. This Teleconference will provide:

discussion of provisions that may impact people with disabilities' decision to work
discussion about state level initiatives and how advocates can become involved

Lowell Arye, a nationally recognized expert on Social Security Disability and other social insurance programs, will discuss federal changes to work incentives including the Ticket To Work and Work Incentives Improvement Act, and other federal initiatives to assist people with disabilities to work without losing their government benefits.

Lowell Arye is currently the Executive Director of the Alliance for the Betterment of Citizens with Disabilities (ABCD), a statewide advocacy organization in New Jersey representing agencies that serve people with multiple physical and developmental disabilities. For ten years, he worked at the federal level in both Congress and the Executive branches of government. He is an elected member of the National Academy of Social Insurance.
